DIRECTIONS

from Highway 401 westbound ... exit 13 towards the tunnel tunnel to USA, continue on to Dougall Ave which turns into ouellette Place, turn right onto Erie St.

from Ambassador Bridge ... take first right after customs booths onto Huron Church northbound, turn right at first light - Wyandotte St, turn right at Ouellette, turn left at Erie St.

from Detroit Windsor Tunnel ... turn left onto Park St, turn left at Ouellette, turn left at Erie St.

Using a GPS ... input 815 Erie St. E., Windsor Ontario which is the start/finish line.

Course Layout

The course is completely flat with four corners and a lap distance of approximately 2 km (the first corner is a traffic circle). The course will be closed for all races. The start/finish line is located on Erie St. E. between Marentette Ave. and Elsmere Ave. From the start line the course direction is clockwise in the order of Erie, Parent, Giles and then Howard. The wheel pit is located at the intersection of Marentette Ave. and Erie St. E.

Nearest Hospital

The closest hospital to the course is Hotel Dieu-Grace Hospital located at the corner of Erie St. and Ouelette Ave., it is 0.5 km west of the race course. The Emergency entrance to the hospital is on Goyeau between Erie St. and Giles Blvd.

Event Rules

- The races will be held under the current rules of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) / Canadian Cycling Association (CCA) with Ontario Cycling Association (OCA) modification.
- Absolutely no public urination. This is a UCI rule. Riders risk instant disqualification and NO REFUND of entry fee. Use the toilets provided at the Start/Finish, on Giles Blvd., and at registration.
- The penalty scale of the CCA rulebook with OCA modifications will be applicable.

- Registration closes 30 minutes before each race, except the Pro race which will be 1 hour before the start. Registration is located in the store front at the finish line.
- There is online registration available at <u>www.ontariocycling.org</u> (which closes Thurs, August 29th at Midnight).
- Onsite registration is payable by cash. No credit/debit cards will be accepted.
- All UCI-licensed riders are eligible to register. OCA Citizen Permit holders under the age of 17 may also register.
- All riders must sign in at registration.
- Races will start promptly at the indicated start times.
- Licensed Commissaires will be officiating.
- There will be no team managers meeting.
- No team vehicles will be permitted on the course.
- No team tents will be permitted, unless a designated location is granted by the organizers, with a donation of \$100.00 to the race, if space is permitting.
- No feeding/handing water bottles during the races.
- Any rider dropping out of the race shall immediately notify a Commissaire.
- Riders may be pulled by the Commissaires when they are about to be lapped or when they fall so far behind as to be deemed out of contention. In no case should lapped riders join an overtaking group.
- There will be free laps for punctures and recognized mishaps, such as crashes or a breakage of an essential part of the bicycle. Riders must report to the Commissaire at the wheel pit to obtain the free lap. Free laps will not be given during the last 5 laps of the race, which will be determined by the position of the leaders. All other incidents are considered unrecognized mishaps.
- In cases where more than one group is on the course at the same time, riders must stay to the right side of the course when being overtaken.
- All riders within the same race will finish on the same lap. If a lapped group is allowed to stay in the race, they will complete fewer laps than the winner.

- Awards will be presented as soon as possible following each race. Top 3 finishers are required to attend the presentation and are expected to wear their competition uniforms.
- The wheel pit will be located near the Start/Finish line. Any incident will be controlled by the Chief Commissaire. This is a wheels in, wheels out pit. All wheels must be marked with a team name, or racer(s) number(s). Bicycle repairs may be made in the wheel pit only.

Number Placement

• Numbers must be placed on the right hip and lower right back. Your number must be visible to the camera, on the right side of the road, to get the placing. No altering of the race numbers is allowed.

Warming Up

• No warming up on the course after the first race of the day starts. Use the side streets in the area.

Equipment Rules

- Per UCI/CCA rules, only traditional wheels or approved non-traditional wheels are permitted. Consult the list of approved non-traditional wheels at: <u>http://www.uci.ch/Modules/BUILTIN/getObject.asp?MenuId=MTkzNg&ObjTypeCod</u> e=FILE&type=FILE&id=NDkyNTc&LangId=1
- Only standard handlebars are permitted. Handlebar extensions including time-trial bar extensions are not permitted.
- Only bicycles that fit the UCI definition are permitted.
- Sleeveless jerseys are not permitted.
- Numbers will be provided by the race organizers.
- Riders are required to wear helmets while racing and while warming up.
- Gear restrictions will be enforced for U-19 (Junior) and U-17 (Minime) categories.
- The use of glass containers is strictly prohibited anywhere on the course.
- Radios are not permitted in any category.

Prizes

• Prize amounts will be determined based on number of participants the day of the race.
