Welcome Cyclists Network Overview

The **goal** of the Welcome Cyclist project and workshops is to create a network of businesses that together enhance a regions cycle tourism product and collectively Ontario's cycle tourism sector.

The Network is open to the following businesses:

- **Accommodation providers**
- **Food service**
- **Tourist attractions**
- **Other cycling related businesses** and organizations interested in cycle tourism

Rationale

- Cycling and cycle tourism is growing area.
- Exploring Southern Ontario's Greenbelt and surrounding areas by bike is a natural fit.
- The workshops and Network will help businesses attract more cyclists and tap into this growing market.
- The Welcome Cyclists workshops are free to attend.
- Networks similar to the Welcome Cyclists Network new in Ontario are successful in Germany, Bett and Bike (5000 business members), Quebec, Bienvenue Cyclists (450 accommodation members) and elsewhere.

- As of April 2010, there are 100 Welcome Cyclists member locations
